



Peer Support

Our local peer support program provide women with information and support from those who understand your experience. They are ready to help their peers navigate hard questions and decisions, whether you are at high risk, have a genetic predisposition or a currently have a cancer diagnosis.

Care Packages

Our care packages have been carefully curated by women who have had breast surgery or GYN surgery, and include everything needed for post surgery care.

"The Roots" A Home for NothingPink

In February 2024, we will open the doors to our support and resource center. It will be designed to provide personalized next steps for someone coming out of a doctor's appointment and learning they have a genetic disposition or a breast or GYN cancer diagnosis. Additionally, it will be a space to offer programming for after cancer care.







Fighting The Good Fight

I found out that I was BRCA1+ in September 2020 after my younger sister was diagnosed with breast cancer at just 26 years old. Through testing, it was discovered that she carried the BRCA1 mutation and her genetic counselor stressed the importance of my other sister, my mom, and myself getting tested as this genetic mutation is hereditary.

After testing confirmed that I too, carried the mutation, I immediately met with a genetic counselor at Atrium Health. Overall, I was feeling very nervous and overwhelmed. My genetic counselor recommended that I reach out to a local support group for BRCA-positive individuals called Nothing Pink. That afternoon, I found them on Facebook and requested to join right away. Because of the pandemic, our bi-weekly support groups have all been virtual. Being able to hear from and connect with other women who understand what you're going through get to hear their personal stories, provide tips for preparing for surgeries and just be there for you while you're making hard decisions, really makes you feel like you're not in this alone.

When I think of Nothing Pink, I feel Support, a sense of community and comfort in a scary time of totally unchartered territory, financial support, and the care packages they sent to help me prepare for my mastectomy and reconstruction surgeries. You'll hear from my two sisters and mom next, but ultimately, all 4 of us carry the BRCA1 mutation. Even though they live in Boston, Nothing Pink opened their doors to my whole family and has been a truly remarkable support system and resource for all of us. For that, we are forever grateful to Nothing Pink! Thank you for supporting Nothing Pink and helping them to continue in their important mission.
